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Children with Disabilities Scholarship Grants Session Law 2013-364

- Applications available October 2013
- Grants awarded Spring 2014
- Up to \$3,000/semester per eligible child
- \$3,670,500 for FY2013-14

Improve Education for Children Who Are Deaf
Session Law 2013-119

- Focus on improving educational outcomes for the deaf and hard of hearing, especially in literacy
- IEP teams must use the "Communication Plan Worksheet" for these children.
- Parents can request: 1) consideration of residential school placement; and 2) that a residential school representative serve on the IEP team.

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Residential School Changes
Session Law 2013-247

- Makes changes to state statutes accounting for the transfer of these three (3) schools from DHHS to DPI
- Establishes SBE as the governing agency with DPI responsible for administration and oversight

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Alternate ACT/PLAN for Certain Students
Session Law 2013-208

- Directs the SBE to develop an alternate to the ACT and PLAN assessments
- New alternates for children who:
 - ✓ Exhibit severe and pervasive delays in all areas;
 - ✓ Follow the extended content standards of the Standard Course of Study; and
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PRTFs: Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facilities
HB 831

Possible legislation for the 2014 Short Session

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Foster Care Children's Bill of Rights
Session Law 2013-326

1. Continued enrollment in current school, if possible
2. Participation in extracurricular school activities
3. Other "ideal objectives"

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Clarify Education Reporting Requirements
Session Law 2013-226

NCGS §115C-107.2(d) revised to limit narrative reporting in IEP forms, whenever practicable.

Session Law 2013-360

1. Children with Disabilities/FY 2013-14
per child allotment: \$3,743.45
2. Funding for Summer Reading
Camps: \$13,578,841

3. **“Duties of school counselors”**
New NCGS § 115C-316.1
Counselors must spend at least 80% of their
work time providing “direct services” to
students.

4. No new awards of career status,
effective 8-1-13
5. Career status permanently eliminated for
all, effective 6-30-18
