





RE: **Out-of-District Application for Funds – FY 2016-17**
Federal Program Report Code (PRC) 060 funds, Ages 3 through 21

Out-of-District (OOD) funds are made available through the State Board of Education to assist in providing special education and related services to eligible children with disabilities. These children are placed by the local education agency (LEA) in alternative school settings approved by the appropriate State Education Agency (SEA) in the state where the school is located.

When a private residential placement has been determined by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team to be the most appropriate placement for a child with disabilities, in-state residential programs should be the first consideration for placement. The LEA should exhaust all possible in-state residential placements before placing a child out-of-state. All children placed in alternative school settings are entitled to the same rights and procedural safeguards as provided to those children whose IEPs are implemented in the LEA. These rights and protections include provisions that link their IEP goals and objectives to the general education curriculum, establish measures of performance and outcomes consistent with those established for their nondisabled peers and require their participation in the same general state and district-wide assessments (or alternate assessments) as nondisabled students.

The Exceptional Children Division may reimburse the LEA for up to 50% of the following costs for a child that the LEA has placed in another LEA or public/private approved residential school:

1. Educational and related services;
2. Residential; and
3. Extended school year (when it has been determined by the IEP Team that extended school year is required as part of the IEP).
