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# Transition Toolkit

# Transition Training Phase One



- Each LEA and Charter with 8<sup>th</sup>-high school grades will identify one Transition Lead ~15-20 per region
- Transition Leads (as identified above) will attend a 1-Day training in the fall in their region; and, will participate in follow-up webinars in phase two
- Training will be in provided in 8 Regions in Train the Trainer format



# Transition Training Phase One Redelivery Plan



- Transition Leads will draft their LEA/Charter redelivery and monitoring plan at their fall regional training
- Transition Leads will finalize their LEA/Charter redelivery plan with approval from their LEA/Charter leadership
- Data collected from the monitoring portion of the plan may be used in the LEA Self-Assessment to identify targeted support needs
- Redelivery and monitoring plan submission date is December 11, 2015



# Transition Training Phase One



- Transition Leads will redeliver training to their LEA/Charter using a common PowerPoint linked to resources in the NC Transition Toolkit
- NC Transition Toolkit will go live after the November trainings
- Redelivery tools will be housed in the Transition Leads wiki

# Transition Training Phase Three

- Student and Parent sections of the NC Transition Toolkit will be built out by summer 2016

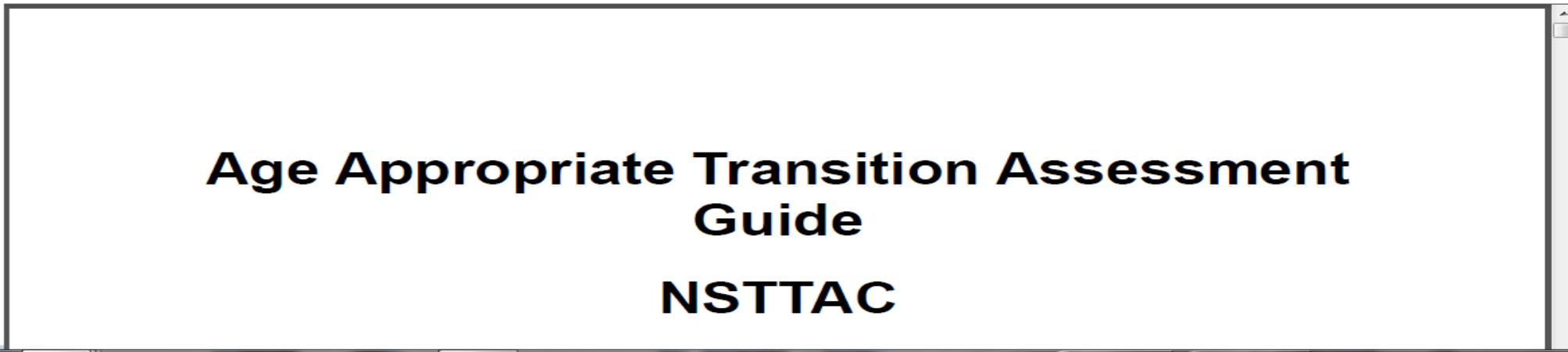
